

Caroline County Board of Supervisors Brick Pavers Honoring First Responders Available for Sale

With the support of the Board of Supervisors, a First Responders Monument has been installed in front of the Caroline County Community Services Center located at 17202 Richmond Turnpike, Milford, Virginia, 22514. The monument honors the County's first responders who provide emergency services in circumstances that are often challenging, emotionally draining, and sometimes dangerous. The monument consists of a brick paver base, benches and flower bed planters and features a stone marker with the inscription: *Honoring Our Brave First Responders Past, Present, Future*. The stone marker also contains symbols for the Sheriff's Office, Caroline Fire-Rescue, Emergency Medical Services and Emergency Communications.



Note: The picture above depicts the First Responders Monument. Dedication pavers are shown in light red. Support pavers are shown in gray around the perimeter. Inscriptions for both pavers will be engraved on site as orders in increments of approximately ten (10) are received.


As part of the First Responders Monument, brick pavers are being made available for sale to the public to honor individuals who have provided dedicated service to Caroline County as a first responder. A 4" x 8" dedication paver inscribed with the first and last name, highest rank attained and dates of service (years only) of the first responder may be purchased for \$100.

Dedication pavers may be purchased for first responders who meet the following criteria:

- a) Must be a current or former employee of the Caroline County Department of Fire-Rescue & Emergency Management, current or former Fire-Rescue volunteer, current or former employee of the Sheriff's Office (including Animal Control Officers and E-911 Dispatchers) or former Animal Control Officers or E-911 Dispatchers who served prior to these operations being placed under the supervision of the Sheriff
- b) Must have served Caroline County for a continuous period of five (5) years at a minimum
- c) Must have departed the organization in good standing
- d) Fire-EMS providers must have served in an operational role for a minimum of five (5) years*


Below is a likeness of the **dedication paver***.

Individuals, families, businesses and organizations who wish to show support for Caroline's first responders and the monument in general may also purchase **support pavers at a cost of \$500**. Support pavers will be displayed around the edge of the monument and consist of a 4" x 8" brick in a contrasting color and may contain a company or organization symbol or logo (support pavers are subject to the approval of the County).
